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## **CMMIS STUDENT SAFETY MEASURES AND GUIDELINES**

This document outlines Chiang Mai Montessori International School's commitment to student safety. It covers risk prevention and management related to school facilities, equipment, transport, off-campus trips, and school activities.

It also includes protocols for emergencies such as fires, storms, floods, and earthquakes, as well as safeguarding students from abuse, substance use, conflicts, abduction, and inappropriate content. Student health and well-being are key priorities.

These measures follow the Guidelines for Practices and Safety Measures in Educational Institutions (Revised Edition, 2009) by the Office of the Basic Education Commission, Ministry of Education.

We thank our teachers, School Board, students, parents, and community for their support in ensuring a safe learning environment at CMMIS.

### **1. Annual Safety Review and Planning at CMMIS**

At CMMIS Chiang Mai Montessori International School, we review and update our student safety plan annually, ensuring a collaborative approach that involves students, teachers, parents, external safety experts, and the wider community. This process includes prevention, resolution, supervision, monitoring, evaluation, and reporting, aligning with national education and child protection policies.

#### **Our Annual Safety Review Process**

1. **Risk Assessment by External Experts:** Engage external safety agencies to conduct a comprehensive risk assessment of school facilities, transport, and emergency preparedness.
2. **Assess the School Environment** - Evaluate school infrastructure, community context, and potential risks such as accidents, environmental hazards, and emergencies.
3. **Review and Refine Core Safety Measures** - Strengthen existing protocols for prevention and emergency response based on assessment findings.
4. **Adapt to Local Needs** - Incorporate additional measures that reflect the school's environment, cultural factors, and emerging risks.
5. **Plan Supporting Activities** - Implement safety drills, awareness programmes, and staff training to reinforce preparedness.



6. **Define Responsibilities and Timelines** - Assign clear roles and set realistic timelines for execution and follow-up.

## **2. School Safety Measures**

CMMIS has outlined safety measures for the following six areas:

### **A.Accident Prevention and Resolution**

Measures to mitigate risks related to accidents within the school premises.

#### **A.1 Accidents from School Buildings and Facilities:**

Preventive Measures:

1. Inspect electrical systems, wiring, and building structures monthly or as necessary.
2. Assign responsible personnel to oversee the maintenance of buildings and facilities.
3. Conduct orientation for new students regarding school facilities.
4. Educate students on maintaining and monitoring the safety of school buildings.
5. Install warning signs and safety maps at hazardous points in every classroom.
6. Organize emergency preparedness drills and evacuation exercises at least once per term.
7. Assign security guards for the school premises.

#### **A.2 Accidents Within School Premises:**

Preventive Measures:

1. Assign on-duty teachers to supervise and monitor safety throughout the day.
2. Appoint personnel to provide first aid and arrange transport to healthcare facilities if needed.
3. Strictly monitor activities involving climbing, swimming pools, or water areas.
4. Regularly trim trees and maintain cleanliness around the school premises.
5. Install warning signs to prevent accidents.
6. Educate students on handling unknown or suspicious objects, including potentially hazardous items.
7. Install adequate lighting around the school premises and at high-risk points.
8. Implement a permission system for students leaving school premises.
9. Provide categorized trash bins for proper waste disposal and management.

**A.3 Accidents from the School Environment:**

Preventive Measures:

1. Survey and address environmental issues and pollution in the school and community.
2. Form a committee involving local authorities to collaborate on preventive and corrective measures.
3. Coordinate with relevant agencies for additional support.
4. Organize activities to raise awareness and foster environmental responsibility among students and staff.

**A.4 Accidents from Tools, Equipment, and Playgrounds:**

Preventive Measures:

1. Regularly inspect and test tools, equipment, playgrounds, and facilities to ensure they are safe for use.
2. Discard and replace damaged tools or equipment promptly.
3. Provide demonstrations and instructions on the proper use of tools and equipment.
4. Ensure proper storage of tools and equipment after use.
5. Supervise students closely while using equipment or facilities.

### **A.5 Accidents During Travel Between Home and School**

#### Preventive Measures:

1. Collaborate with parents and the community to establish safe student pick-up and drop-off points.
2. Supervise and assist parents during student arrivals and departures.
3. Assign on-duty teachers to monitor student movement.
4. Provide guidance on school regulations to ensure safety.
5. Designate safe and efficient traffic routes for school zones.

### **A.6 Accidents During Off-Campus Study Trips and Activities**

#### Preventive Measures:

1. Follow the Ministry of Education's regulations for off-campus trips strictly.
2. Plan and prepare thoroughly for all trips and activities. Fill out the risk assessment form.
3. Maintain detailed records of participating students.
4. Assign teachers to supervise and enforce discipline during activities.
5. Provide name tags or identification for all participants.
6. Ensure necessary first aid supplies are available.
7. Monitor food purchases to maintain hygiene and safety.
8. Inspect vehicles and driver credentials for safety compliance.
9. Avoid high-risk activities during trips or events.
10. Closely monitor and supervise student safety throughout.
11. Educate students on safe practices during activities.
12. Confirm the suitability and safety of venues.
13. Coordinate with road safety officers to enhance security.

## **A.7 Accidents During Key Activities**

Preventive Measures:

1. Avoid high-risk activities that could lead to accidents.
2. Monitor and supervise student safety closely.
3. Educate students on safe participation practices.
4. Assign teachers to enforce discipline consistently.
5. Confirm the safety of venues before activities.
6. Coordinate with road safety officers as needed.
7. Provide first aid units at all major activities.

## **B. Disaster Prevention and Resolution**

Preparedness for natural disasters such as fires, storms, floods, and earthquakes.

### **B.1 Fire Incidents**

Preventive Measures:

1. Assign a committee to regularly inspect fire equipment.
2. Educate students about fire prevention and evacuation procedures.
3. Ensure strict security with on-duty personnel for school premises.
4. Develop contingency plans for emergencies.
5. Maintain a directory of emergency contacts for assistance.
6. Clear clutter from buildings and rooms to reduce fire hazards.
7. Report incidents immediately to relevant authorities.

## **B.2 Storms**

6. Provide first aid kits for emergencies.

## **B.4 Earthquakes**

5. Monitor weather and seismic activity updates.
6. Ensure first aid kits are readily available.

### **C. Social Problem Management**

Strategies to address issues such as physical abuse, substance abuse, and conflicts.

#### **C.1 Physical and Mental Abuse**

Preventive Measures:

1. Appoint a committee to monitor and prevent undesirable student behaviors in high-risk areas such as classrooms and restrooms.
2. Educate teachers, students, parents, and the community about abuse prevention.
3. Provide counseling services for affected students.
4. Implement a structured and continuous student welfare monitoring system.
5. Assign personnel responsible for reporting incidents through proper channels.
6. Provide close supervision and follow-up for students in need of assistance.
7. Collaborate with parents to provide support and care.
8. Coordinate with relevant agencies, such as child shelters and police stations, for additional assistance.

#### **C.2. Self-Harm and Suicide Prevention**

Preventive Measures:

1. Establish an effective system to monitor and assist students, assigning teachers to observe individual behaviors.

3. Conduct activities that foster love, unity, and mutual care among students.
4. Organize diverse activities to develop students' potential.
5. Partner with experts to provide regular counseling.
6. Notify parents immediately when issues arise to address problems promptly.

### **C.3 Substance Abuse**

Preventive Measures:

1. Conduct life skills training to raise awareness and self-esteem among students.
2. Establish communication networks between parents, communities, and schools to prevent and address student behavior issues.
3. Organize activities allowing students to express their abilities through art, music, sports, etc.
4. Form monitoring groups using internal and external networks within the school.
5. Organize training sessions to instill moral and ethical values in students.
6. Provide education on selecting appropriate media consumption.
7. Maintain a clean, green, and safe school environment conducive to learning.
8. Continuously implement student monitoring systems.
9. Assign personnel to address substance abuse issues in the school.
10. Regularly screen and monitor students' health.

### **C.4 Consumer Protection**

Preventive Measures:

1. Establish a consumer protection club (Youth FDA) within the school to monitor food quality and contaminants and disseminate relevant information.
2. Develop posters and campaigns to educate students on proper hygiene and product usage.
3. Ensure staff regularly clean and maintain orderliness in the school cafeteria.
4. Implement waste management systems, wastewater treatment, and grease traps.
5. Provide first aid promptly for accidents related to consumption before hospital referrals.
6. Notify parents immediately in case of incidents.
7. Appoint health teachers to assist with student health monitoring and liaise with parents.
8. Report incidents to relevant authorities promptly.

### **C.5 Conflicts and Fights**

Preventive Measures:

1. Implement effective student welfare systems to address conflict resolution.
2. Establish networks between parents, communities, and schools to communicate and address behavior issues.
3. Form rapid response units to resolve fights and conflicts, coordinating with the police when needed.
4. Notify parents of involved students and provide monitoring while reporting to higher authorities.
5. Collaborate with law enforcement and local authorities for preventive measures.

### **C.6 Abduction and Exploitation**

Preventive Measures:

1. Conduct activities to develop analytical thinking, problem-solving, decision-making, and self-defense skills in students.
2. Implement an effective security system with assigned security personnel.
3. Collaborate with communities and parent networks to monitor students closely.
4. Work with relevant authorities to prevent abduction and exploitation.
5. Regularly disseminate information on preventing abduction and exploitation.
6. Notify parents and police promptly to aid in search and rescue efforts.
7. Engage teachers, parents, and the community in providing tips or reports of suspicious activities.
8. Notify higher authorities immediately for further assistance.

### **C.7 Pornographic Content**

#### Preventive Measures:

1. Control the circulation of inappropriate sexual content and media in the school.
2. Develop integrated curricula on sex education, moral values, and social ethics.
3. Conduct activities to instill moral values and address inappropriate behaviors.
4. Collaborate with relevant authorities to monitor and restrict access to harmful content.
5. Confiscate inappropriate materials and inform parents to resolve behavioral issues.
6. Assign teachers to monitor and follow up with students after intervention.

### **C.8 Vice and Addictions**

#### Preventive Measures:

1. Declare the school a vice-free zone.
2. Develop zoning maps with the community to restrict vice-related activities.
3. Conduct awareness activities on the harmful effects of vices on students' education and well-being.
4. Assign teachers to monitor and intervene in students' risky behaviors promptly.
5. Survey and map vice-related hotspots to collaborate with relevant authorities for preventive action.
6. Engage parents to monitor children's expenses, phone usage, and extracurricular activities closely.
7. Form networks with parents and the community to share information and monitor risky behaviors.
8. Organize meetings with parents to discuss solutions and provide support.

## **D. STUDENT HEALTH AND HYGIENE**

Promotion of health and well-being through preventive and responsive measures.

#### Preventive Measures

1. Provide teachers and staff with knowledge on student health promotion, environmental pollution prevention, and measures to reduce disease outbreaks.
2. Implement waste management policies within the school.



3. Assign a clear committee responsible for health-related tasks.
4. Conduct annual health checkups for students and coordinate with hospitals to monitor and care for vulnerable students closely.
5. Close the school temporarily during outbreaks of contagious diseases.
6. Notify higher-level authorities in the event of a disease outbreak within the school.
7. Ensure the availability of safe drinking and utility water, maintaining hygienic water storage and distribution systems.
8. Provide clean and hygienic restrooms.
9. Provide proper handwashing facilities and educate students on correct handwashing techniques.
10. Monitor the cleanliness of food preparation and distribution to ensure proper hygiene.
11. Maintain a clean and hygienic environment throughout the school premises.

### **E. Mitigation of Risks from Dangerous Animals**

Measures to reduce harm caused by venomous or dangerous animals.

Preventive Measures:

1. Maintain a clean and shaded environment, trim tree branches, and remove habitats that attract dangerous animals to ensure student safety.
2. Educate teachers, staff, and students about identifying dangerous animals, prevention methods, and basic first aid for venomous bites or stings.
3. Install warning signs in high-risk areas, such as near fences or large trees commonly inhabited by dangerous animals.
4. Collaborate with relevant agencies to eliminate animal breeding grounds, such as mosquito breeding sites.
5. Prepare first aid kits and necessary equipment for treating venomous bites or stings.
6. Develop and practice emergency response plans in collaboration with relevant agencies.

**F. Prevention of Threats, Crimes, and Security Risks** - Ensuring safety from criminal activities and external threats.

Preventive Measures:

1. Organize activities to enhance students' critical thinking, problem-solving, decision-making, and counseling skills, as well as self-defense techniques to protect themselves from threats, risks, and crimes.
2. Establish an efficient security system with on-duty guards and security personnel to monitor school premises.
3. Collaborate with the community and parent networks to ensure consistent monitoring of students.
4. Coordinate with relevant authorities to monitor and prevent threats, risks, and criminal activities.
5. Regularly disseminate information on potential threats, risks, and crimes, and educate students on preventive measures.
6. Work with law enforcement and parents to track and monitor students' safety and prevent potential threats.
7. Encourage teachers, parents, community members, and relevant parties to report suspicious activities or potential threats.
8. Notify parents and report incidents to higher authorities immediately when an issue occurs.
